I. Each calendar year is made up of two semesters of 16 weeks each and one summer session. A semester hour is the work of a class meeting one period a week for 16 weeks, or the equivalent in laboratory or shop. The length of a class period is 50 minutes or the equivalent.

The "DEAN'S HONOR ROLL" notation was not included on our records until Spring Semester 1980, although the honor had existed for decades.

IV. GRADE POINTS

Before May 1955 for each hour of work which the student took, grade points were given according to the grade attained, as follows: Grade A, 3 points; B, 2 points; C, 1 point; D, I, Wd and Au, no points; F and Wf, -1 point.

After May 1955 grade points are given according to the grade attained as follows: A, 4 points; B, 3 points; C, 2 points; D, 1 point; I, Wd, Au, F, Wf, CR, NCR, S, U, P, no points.

Courses for which credit is awarded, but with no grade points, DO NOT COUNT in computing the Grade Point Average (GPA). Examples: courses with a "P" or "CR" grade, or, undergraduate courses taken by a graduate student.

V. PARENTHESES () AND BRACKETS []

Prior to Fall 1958, any hours in () did not count in computing GPA, except "WF" or "F" hours in () did count in computing the GPA unless the course was repeated. **Beginning Fall 1958**, "WF" or "F" hours in [] count in computing the GPA; any hours in () do NOT count, either in computing the GPA or otherwise.

VI. SEMESTER TOTALS

Beginning Spring Semester 1974, **four sets** of totals are listed at the end of each semester on most records, unless "repeats" or grade changes were subsequently processed. - Courses numbered 300 to 499 are taught primarily for juniors and seniors. Freshmen and sophomores may also be admitted if they satisfy the course prerequisites given in the WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY CATALOG. Graduate students may not take these courses for graduate credit.
- Courses numbered 500 to 699 are aimed primarily at juniors and seniors, but graduate students may also receive credit for these courses.
- Courses numbered 700 to 799 are structured primarily for graduate students, but undergraduate students may be admitted if they meet course prerequisites.
- Courses numbered 800 to 999 are designed for graduate students only, and no student may be admitted to these courses unless he has been admitted to the Graduate School.

VETERANS ADMINISTRATION CERTIFICATION

VETERANS NOTE

Please read this carefully and be aware of the following new regulations. THEY COULD AFFECT YOU. We expect and ENCOURAGE any questions you might have regarding this communication. Also, please be aware that these rules are Federal Regulations regarding the GI Bill and do not necessarily represent the rules governing you and Monroe County Community College.

1. In order to receive VA benefits you must attend 12 or more VA Regulations require that you notify the Office of the Registrar when you are attending classes so that we can notify the Veterans Administration. Failure to notify the college could result in an interruption of your VA benefits. You must notify the Veterans Administration for all months paid to the veteran beginning with the period you stopped attending your classes.
2. You may repeat a required class you have "failed" (F, F-) only once UNLESS you can prove mitigating circumstances. You may not, however, repeat a class you have passed. For instance, to take a grade from a "D" to a higher grade.
3. If you are enrolled and have been certified to the VA for 2 or more subjects, you must complete (PASS) at least half (1/2) of the courses. If during 2 semesters you do not earn (pass) at least 50% you will not be certified to the Veterans Administration for any further semester until you have a semester in which you make ACADEMIC (usually GPA) progress.
4. All students receiving Veterans Administration benefits are required to report immediately to the office of the Registrar when they officially withdraw or are otherwise in a class or change from credit to audit.

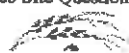

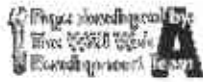

Dear Mr. Frein:

This is in response to your letter of July 27, concerning undergraduate majors. A student is identified by a major code each semester he/she is enrolled, and the primary purpose of that code is to connect the student with the appropriate advisor. We used a "pre-law" major code for many years in this context, but we have never had a formal curriculum in "pre-law." Students who saw the pre-law advisor would graduate in a "regular" major - probably political science or psychology.

There is a separate major associated with a person's degree, and sometimes we have not always caught inappropriate degree majors like "pre-law" and corrected them. So it is possible that a person's WSU record might say their degree major was pre-law (a mistake), but in fact we have never offered an undergraduate degree with a major in pre-law.


Dear Sir:
