Re: Ricky Swope - Training

Ms. Miller:

Ricky Swope was hired by the Monroe Police Department on January 2, 1979.

Ricky received 40 hours of indoctrination by the Officers of the Department. This procedure serves a two-fold purpose in that it gets the person conditioned mentally for the Police Academy ahead, and covers localized procedures, ordinances, Rules and Regulations, etc.

Ricky received his basic law enforcement training for certification at the Macomb County Community College Criminal Justice Training Center in Warren, Michigan from January 8 through March 9, 1979. The training consisted of 360 hours, although only mandated at 320 hours.

After successful completion of the prescribed courses, Ricky was assigned to Training Officers for a period of three or four months. During this period he received on-the-job in-service training which put to practical use the training received at the Academy. Also developed was more knowledge of the area served, manner of service, localized problems, procedures, rules, etc. During his tenure he was also subjected to updated training in criminal law, firearms, etc. Training in law enforcement is an ongoing, continuous operation.

Item #4 is dated January 20, 1982, but is very similar to the process and training received by Ricky in 1979. This update was only to clean up the language. I included the entire basic program to give you a little more insight
